Routine Immunization Schedule for Infants and Children

2 months	DTaP-IPV-Hib (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Acellular Pertussis, Inactivated Polio Vaccine, <i>Haemophilus influenzae</i> type b) HB (Hepatitis B) Pneum C (Pneumococcal 7 Valent Conjugate) Men-C-C (Meningococcal C Conjugate)
4 months	DTaP-IPV-Hib (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Acellular Pertussis, Inactivated Polio Vaccine, <i>Haemophilus influenzae</i> type b) Pneum C (Pneumococcal 7 Valent Conjugate) HB (Hepatitis B)
6 months	DTaP-IPV-Hib (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Acellular Pertussis, Inactivated Polio Vaccine, Varicella/Chickenpox) Pneum C (Pneumococcal 7 Valent Conjugate) Men-C-C (Meningococcal C Conjugate)
12 months	Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) HB (Hepatitis B) VAR (Varicella/Chickenpox)
18 months	DTaP-IPV-Hib (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Acellular Pertussis, Inactivated Polio Vaccine, <i>Haemophilus influenzae</i> type b) Pneum C (Pneumococcal 7 Valent Conjugate) Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)
4-6 years	DTaP-IPV (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Acellular Pertussis, Inactivated Polio Vaccine)
14-16 years	dTap (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Acellular Pertussis) (<i>usually administered in school</i>) Men-C-C (Meningococcal C Conjugate)

Common side effects of immunizations include soreness and redness at the site of the injection, irritability/fussiness, and/or mild fever. If your child experiences anything more severe, please contact your physician and report all severe reactions to one of the Community Health Nurses at the Whitehorse Health Center. If you are in a Yukon community outside of Whitehorse, please report the reaction to the local Community Nurse Practitioner.
